<b>Module 1 – Qualities of an umpire</b>	Date
• demonstrates honesty, impartiality & integrity	
• displays respect, teamwork & trust	
<b>Module 2 – Manage Self</b>	
• prepares for the requirements of officiating	
• demonstrates strategies to improve their umpiring (sets/reviews goals, trains, accepts feedback)	
<b>Module 3 – Manage Environment</b>	
• ensures a safe environment exists for all boundary umpires	
• copes positively with match-day challenges	
<b>Module 4 – Manage Match</b>	
• displays confidence whilst umpiring and communicating with other umpires (whistle/signals)	
• displays alertness and composure with decision-making	
<b>Module 5 – Laws &amp; Interpretations</b>	
• generally applies the Laws of Australian Football with regards to Boundary Umpiring	
• generally applies the Laws with consistency and composure	
<b>Module 6 – Positioning</b>	
• adjusts position when contest for the ball is close to the boundary line	
• commonly establishes the desired positions for set-plays (centre square ball-ups, kicks to score, kick-ins)	
<b>Module 7 – Skills &amp; Techniques</b>	
• demonstrates basic signals under match-conditions (incl. out-of-bounds & out-on-the-full)	
• demonstrates effective whistle use and performs the boundary-throw-in as desired	
<b>Module 8 – Managing Others</b>	
• demonstrates an understanding of other match officials' specific roles	
• communicates effectively with other members of the umpiring team
